WANT A BIT OF FUN WITH SOME COMPETITVENESS THROWN IN?

As we all know Croquet is a marvellous game which can be played from childhood through to old age. There is Association with it's all important roqueting, angles, tactics and forward thinking, Golf with its blocking accuracy, making 1 shot do many things and jumping over balls in hoops and then there is Aussie Croquet.

I believe this was introduced primarily for schoolchildren and I must say that they most certainly do enjoy this form of the game. The students we've had in the past have been very varied both in temperament and in natural ability but all have taken great delight in knocking the teachers ball out of the hoop! The vast majority of the youngsters have been competitive and then again there were a few whose body language left us all in no doubt at all that they would rather have been at Macca's. They played Doubles and we chose the partners quite randomly which worked pretty well. We were prewarned that some of the students had poor communication skills and behavioural issues but we ignored all that and just spoke to them one on one and explained the game to them.

One of the main aims of the visits was to give the youngsters an experience of cooperating with each other and discussing tactics with their partner. It's amazing how some of them grasped the concept instantly and with relish, while some others took a bit longer to get the gist of it.

The 1st and 2nd colours are as usual starting with Blue or Green and everyone has their turn in the correct order. If you hit a ball you get another shot, hit another one, you get another shot etc. but you can only hit each ball once but you can do a 'safety shot' (hitting a ball you've already used) usually at the end of your turn to maybe get a strong opponent out of the way! If you hit the same ball twice in your turn without using them all then that is the end of your turn. The objective is that all 4 balls must go through each hoop but once you and your partner are through then you can proceed to the next hoop, ideally you want to bash the other 2 balls away to give yourselves a bit more time to get through the next hoop. Basically you want to help your partner and thwart the opposition. Jump shots are allowed. We only do 6 hoops then the Peg. The ball is measured in at the start which is along the baulk line A or B and usually you try to get through the hoop straight away. I think I've read somewhere that you can start with the ball placed in the first hoop but that might be for younger children so they don't get too frustrated trying to get through the first hoop as we all know how that feels! The ball is measured in only when it goes out.

The great thing about Aussie is that it is very social and people with different skill levels can be matched together and the weaker player learns from the stronger one. The feed back we had from the teachers was that the experience was hugely positive and some of the students that normally struggled with interaction in general, coped amazingly well and it really improved their self-confidence.

Mower Give Away

The South Terrace Croquet Club has been keeping its old croquet lawn mower in storage as a backup mower since outsourcing greenkeeping services several years ago.

The mower is a 30-inch Scott Bonnar electrical cylinder mower with accompanying grass catcher and an extensive heavy duty electric cable.

Due to space pressures in their storage shed, the South Terrace Committee has resolved to give away this mower to any South Australian Croquet Club that may have a need for it.
