# **UK PLAYERS VISIT ADELAIDE**

Six SA croquet clubs hosted a team of 14 English Croquet Players during the first two weeks of November 2019. This visit came about following a tour by Hyde Park to England in 2018 and followed a similar format of a day's play with host club V visitors before lunch and mixed play afterwards.

An exhaustive program of matches, sightseeing, dining and intermixed with limited rest periods were organised by Andrew Larpent (UK) and Philip Hadley (HP). Barry Haydon coordinated the program of matches with the Clubs concerned.

The tour saw games played at Hyde Park, Norwood, Victor Harbor, Brighton, Millswood and Glenunga where clubs were asked to match, as closely as possible, the handicaps of the tourists. In most cases this request was achieved resulting in a series of close competitions – the final score being 2 test wins to the tourists and 4 to the hosts.

Tourism sights at least included Mt Lofty, Glenelg, Barossa Valley, McLaren Vale, Kangaroo Island and Adelaide Oval. Various restaurants were supported but the Red Ochre & Windy Point gained particular mention.

The croquet part of the tour started on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> November when all of the touring party visited Hyde Park for a few hours in the afternoon to have a hit, dust off the cobwebs and, for those who didn't bring their own mallet, borrow a mallet from the Club for the duration of the tour. They then returned for their first match on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup>. The day had a Melbourne Cup theme and the Club Room looked spectacular with a combination of Australian / British decorations. Afternoon social play didn't really start until THE race was over. As well as morning tea and lunch the Club also provided a BBQ tea – the only problem being that the visitors said they had eaten and too much.

It is understood that all clubs involved pulled out all stops to ensure the visitors had a good time ..... and some competitive matches. As expected, hospitality was extensive at each venue and extremely well received. Offers of reciprocation were numerous. #### WHAT WAS THAT?

What do you get when you cross some coach travel amongst magnificent scenery, with some caving, geyser and other geothermal watching, searching for the nearly extinct Kiwi, leisurely walking (or is that hiking) with plenty of shopping, great food, wine tasting, riding the luge and a self-drive electric train, checking out croquet mallets being made (at George Wood's) all together with the hospitality of 6 different croquet clubs for games of GC.

#### **Answer**

It must be the Hyde Park Croquet Club's tour of New Zealand. For a fortnight or so from the 18<sup>th</sup> November 25 members (about a third of the Club's membership) went touring. The tour was predominately a Golf Croquet playing tour against New Zealand clubs in the North Island. Clubs visited were Epsom Remuera



(Auckland), Claudelands (near Hamilton), Rotorua, Mt Maunganui, Heretaunga (near Napier), and Kelburn (Wellington). For most Clubs the format was the same – a series of friendly test matches in the morning and generally some more relaxed social games in the afternoon. Each club did their best to come up with competitive games by matching our handicap levels – in some cases this meant importing players to boost their numbers. Fortunately they did this well but not so well that we couldn't hold our own on the field. In fact we won all but one (Mt Maunganui) of our competitive play, a result all tour members were pleased with. Fortunately, other than a couple of niggles, everyone remained fit and healthy for the trip. Unfortunately, 2 of our members didn't make it across the start line – talk to Barrie Wuttke about his knees at some stage.

If anyone wants to know more about the tour or organise one of their own they should contact Philip Hadley, the main organiser for the tour. And no, although we are assured they exist we didn't see any live Kiwis.
