WOMENS GOLF CROQUET CHAMPIONSHIPS

This year's Women's Championship began in perfect autumnal conditions. With a field of six, on day one we had three "5" handicappers pitted against 3 "zero" handicappers and results might have appeared predictable, but not so. In the first three games, two of the "5" handicappers were victorious and in the third game the "zero" handicapper was taken to a tiebreaker. In an event where the winner was to be decided on matches won (in two game matches), by the end of the day only one player was undefeated.

Day two was far less autumnal, but still good weather for croquet, if a little cool for spectators.

Games were timed at one hour each, and on only rare occasions did timers sound to end games, indicating that the one hour limit seemed to work very well. In the end it was a battle between the top two competitors, with only the results of the final two games determining the ranking order, making for an exciting tournament.

Both finalists won four matches each, so it came down to net games to determine the final result. Congratulations to winner Virginia Arney with four matches, 8 net games, and to runner-up Karen Magee, with four match wins and 6 net games.

The event was managed by Millswood Croquet Club, and referees included Ann Woodhouse, Barry Jennings, Graeme Thomas and Barry Haydon.

MENS GOLF CROQUET CHAMPIONSHIPS

Seven players participated in a round robin format of two-game matches, each of one hour's duration. Players ranged in handicaps from +4 to -1. By close of day one, with players completing either six or eight games, three competitors had won two matches with one other winning one match for the day.

The standard of play was enthralling and it was good to see some spectators about over the two days but the level of play was such that it would have satisfied even a full gallery of onlookers. A feature of play over the two days was the frequency and consistency and accuracy of long roquet shots.

On Sunday morning, players whipped through each of their games in well under the allotted hour so that all final matches were under way prior to midday. At the commencement of the final matches there were still three players in contention for first place but in the end the honours clearly went to Barry Haydon, who won four matches, from Runner-up Jiim Grindrod, on three matches.

Millswood Croquet Club was the Event Manager and Referees were Anne Woodhouse, Karen McGee and Graeme Thomas.

Gateball is played by more than 10 million players throughout Asia and South America.

The Gateball National Championships 2019 will be held at Victorian Croquet Centre, Cairnlea from Friday 28 November to Sunday 1 December. In 2017 teams from China, South Korea and Paraguay participated; it is a great way to make international sporting contacts.

SACA LAWNS Players are reminded to use the ramps and steps with handrails provided when exiting the lawns—especially in wet weather—to avoid slipping on the wet concrete.

COMPETITION ENTRY FEES—REMINDER

Clubs are now sent an invoice for entries and lawn fees. Clubs are requested to submit entries via the appropriate on-line entry form. For individual and doubles events players are also requested to complete an on-line entry and are encouraged to submit entry fees direct to Croquet SA via bank transfer.

PARKING AT HUTT ROAD The Adelaide City Council has agreed that Croquet SA members when using Hutt Road car park should **display their Croquet SA ID card** on the dashboard if expecting to be parked for any length of time that will exceed the current parking restrictions .
