#### FROM THE ARCHIVES

# WILMINGTON CROQUET CLUB 1913–1972

The game was first introduced to the town when Mrs E.P. Dignan invited ladies to participate on rough courts at the back of her home. Interest was created to such an extent that by 1913 the Wilmington Club was formed. Mr. Dignan lent the ladies an allotment and courts were laid out. Play began on a very uneven surface as the owner did not wish the area to be surfaced.

Facilities were used from the tennis club for afternoon teas and meetings. Records show that on occasion Fred Bird's tearooms, the parish hall and the supper room of the local Institute were used.

On May 3 1924, a meeting of members was held to discuss the feasibility of establishing croquet courts of a more suitable nature. A site was selected on the corner of Melrose Terrace. This is where the courts were eventually situated. A small clubhouse was constructed.

The opening of the new courts was performed by Mrs Linklater who, on the same day was farewelled. At this time she had held the position as secretary and also had been captain for a number of years.

Over the years many home-and-away games had been played between





neighbouring clubs of Port Pirie, Port Augusta, Quorn, Orroroo, Gladstone, Melrose, Wirrabara and Solomontown. The popularity of the game had extended to such a degree that at the opening of play in 1938 there were 82 ladies attending.

During 1954 the Club applied to the Wilmington Progress for a site for proposed new courts in the Community Recreation Centre. The move did not eventuate until 1963 when assistance was given by other sporting bodies. the Agricultural and Horticulture Society, Wilmington District Council and members of the public.

By 1964 the courts had taken shape, and in June the new Club House was commenced.

The completed venue was opened by Mrs Thomas Dunn, an old identity of the district.

Unfortunately, since then membership declined and the club has been in recess since 1972.
