HUTT ROAD LAWNS CONNECTED TO GLENELG ADELAIDE PARKLANDS (GAP) RECYCLED WATER SCHEME

After many long years trying to find a way to connect to the GAP scheme, the project has finally come to fruition and Croquet SA is now using recycled water to irrigate our lawns at Hutt Road.

Our problem has always been the cost of bringing the water to our lawns from the main GAP pipeline approximately 250 meters north of the clubhouse. In the past this cost has proved to be prohibitive due to the distance involved and the difficulty of bringing the pipe through trees without causing them damage.

Three or four years ago the main pipeline was extended further east to allow Pembroke School to connect to the scheme for its playing fields and, with the cooperation of Pembroke, this brought about change to the route for our connecting pipeline and allowed us to avoid most of the trees.

Then last year we received a major boost when we were successful in obtaining a grant of \$13,000 from the Adelaide City Council. This allowed us to proceed with the project which has been very capably undertaken by our groundsman David Watchman.

We now have a much improved and upgraded irrigation system with new solenoids and 5 new sprinklers replacing the previous 13. The recycled water is delivered at a higher pressure than mains water so that fewer sprinklers are required and watering times are reduced. We have reduced our consumption of mains water and the environmental benefits of using recycled water are many. Moreover, in the long term it is expected that there will be significant financial benefits as the recycled water is considerably cheaper than mains water.

Croquet SA wish to thank the City Council for its generous grant which made the project possible, Pembroke School for its cooperation which was very freely given, and David Watchman for a job well done.

WHAT DO WE GET FROM DOING HAMMER TIME? - A CLUB PERSPECTIVE

Hammer Time ties up a club when it is being run and perhaps provides a little more income during that period of time. It is very member driven.

At Norwood Croquet Club we are in the enviable position of being basically full on normal club days particularly with a strong Golf croquet group (they are dividing the lawns and playing third colours on their day)

In April my wife decided she would like to try croquet and another lady also wanted to give it a go.

I undertook to teach them and two other friends who hadn't played. We started on Thursday nights as the courts were free and I taught them using the prescribed coaching method.

We start with Aussie - which fundamentally is golf croquet except all players make all the hoops and if they go through a hoop they earn another stroke and if they hit another ball they earn another stroke. It is an excellent teaching tool as beginners develop hoop-running and roqueting skills but most importantly they have FUN.

Then we progress to Ricochet - this is only one stroke different to Aussie - but by planning you can make several hoops in one turn. Finally I introduce the croquet stroke and without even realising it they are playing Association.

My beginners must have enjoyed themselves as it was 3 degrees on the lawns some nights.

Just as my beginners reached Association level of play we had 4 new people join us (from playing Hammer Time in summer) and when they had made some progress we had another four join, who had heard about the group through word of mouth.

Then we had Norwood's Hammer Time where we suggested they "come 'n' try" the beginners' Friday night group.

We now have two groups (about 8 players) coming though. Naturally this is way beyond me but I am well supported by Sally Harper, Phil Bateman, Marlene Roberts, Polly Butler and many others. The committee has more or less left the group alone which has been remarkable.

So why hold Hammer Time? Since April the club has grown by 10 members with many playing Association games weekly. Embrace the opportunities Hammer Time can offer your club. The age and demographic of our new players are varied with some nearing retirement and others younger – all looking for a fun and enjoyable way to spend an evening with possibilities leading to a competitive game if desired.

At least half of them joined after they enjoyed Hammer Time. The lifted profile of the sport is attracting them...BUT THEY WANT FUN. This is a game and should be fun!
