#### HALL OF FAME PRESENTATION

Congratulations to Bryan Dawson who was presented with a certificate commemorating his induction into the World Croquet Federation by WCF President Ian Burridge of Wales, during the Opening Ceremony of the World Croquet

Federation Association Croquet World Championship, held at the Victorian Croquet Centre, Melbourne, 15<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2020.

# **CITATION**

Bryan Dawson is a resident of Adelaide, South Australia and played Association Croquet competitively from 1988 to 2013. He made regular appearances in the Australian Men's and Open Championships from the start of his career to the early 2000s and was a stalwart of the South Australian Interstate Team from 1991 to 2011. In 1999, he travelled to the USA to play in the Sonoma-Cutrer and Resort at the Mountain events and, in 2000, represented Australia in the MacRobertson Shield in New Zealand as well as making a second appearance at Sonoma-Cutrer.

However, Bryan made his major contribution to the game of croquet as the maker of the eponymous Dawson Ball, the premier competition croquet ball for over 25 years from the early 1990s. In his Adelaide workshop, he undertook years of painstaking research into the precise mix of plastics and colours required for the cold moulding process that would produce a croquet ball that met the official specifications reliably by

being perfectly round, robust enough to withstand years of vigorous use and almost totally resilient to temperature changes.

Given these characteristics, the ball that steadily took centre stage in almost every croquet-playing country in the world was the Dawson Ball.

The only exception was in Egypt which had been self-sufficient in ball-making for decades. The Egyptian Croquet Federation recognised that it made sense to use Dawson Balls in their own international events not only to suit foreign visitors but also to prepare their own players for using Dawson Balls in world championships. The Dawson Ball can now claim to be genuinely ubiquitous.

Bryan retired from ball manufacturing and sold the business in 2017 to a fellow Australian who continues to manufacture Dawson Balls and export them all over the world. Bryan's unique contribution to modern croquet will be remembered and appreciated by croquet players for as long as the Dawson Ball continues to be used.

# Bryan Dawson's acknowledgement on receiving the World Croquet Federation award

Good day. I would like to thank the World Croquet Federation for this award and for everyone that nominated me for it. I would also like to say thanks to June, my wife, for her massive effort in promoting and selling the Dawson 2000 ball worldwide. She is a very clever lady.

My school years were hopeless but I had brilliant hands and could make just about anything. I failed in grade 1-3-6 and left school in grade 6. I didn't even get to high school. At 14 I left school and worked with dad in our joinery and cabinet making business. At that stage I could not even read a ruler properly.

I loved inventing things. Even as a kid my head would be thinking what can I do next. I loved anything mechanical and as life went on, I built my own machines and everything to do with croquet ball manufacturing.

When I was 20 years old I build my first crossbow with a precision mechanism. It was all handmade and beautiful. The Mount Gambier Border Watch newspaper was so impressed I got the front page. It was then put on display for the local police and others to look at it. I still have it today 56 years later.

My father was a perfectionist. Everything had to be perfect or you ended up on the wood heap chopping firewood for days. The perfection was drummed into me and so in my life of manufacturing it had to be perfect or thrown in the bin. My father sacked me 13 times in 3 years. I guess it made me the person I am today.

When I got into the croquet business I mainly made mallets for 3 years and then I decided its time I learned how to play the game. The first thing they asked me was "when are you going to produce a decent croquet ball".

I was young and loved the challenge and so started thinking how should I do it. Will I try this or that. It was very complicated. I had to get rebound, size and temperature right. I thought of a way to manufacture the perfect ball which is foolproof and the results are impressive. I'm the only one in the world to use this technique and the balls are still made that way today and will be for years into the future.

Now months of searching for different materials, I finally came up with a rough prototype ball. I asked Neil Spooner to have a hit with it. He thought it was great. We came up with several different balls for the Australian market. Over the next few years they were all tested and approved by England every 3 years.

The balls were good, but I wanted better. I wanted perfection! I came home from playing at Sonoma USA and started on a new very precision alloy master ball. It was 6 weeks with high magnification on the lathe to come up with the most precision master ball of all time.

We now had to obtain the world market. The ball was so brilliant it created its own market.

The years of manufacturing wasn't easy. I worked incredible hours, 7 days a week and would never give in to any problems. Just keep fighting.

I am very proud and so is my family, including my twin brother Kevin, of how I came from nothing to achieve a place in the Hall of Fame. It's unbelievable. Also thanks to June, my wife, again for her determination and fight for our wonderful croquet ball.
