Gateball — SA President's Doubles

The fourth edition of the SA President's Gateball Doubles competition saw a couple of innovations this year. The first of these was that I was responsible for organising the tournament for the first time, which was an interesting, and ultimately rewarding experience, if somewhat nerve shredding along the way with the ever changing border restrictions – the number of pairs for the tournament varied from 4 to 9 in the lead up, and ultimately settled at 6, which allowed us to run 2 courts and hold a round-robin tournament.



Saturday morning opened to glorious Gateball weather, and the pre-tournament favourites did not disappoint with Barry and Karen on 4 wins and Philip and Ben on 3 wins but superior net gates going into the final game.

An honourable mention goes to Ros and Keith who travelled the furthest and beat the winners and lost narrowly on a shoot out to the runners up, to finish in third place – a terrific result.

On Sunday, we held our first SA State teams event. With only two teams, and a couple of players unable to compete, we ended up with two teams of 5.

The first team was the "Shanghai 6" comprising Barry J, Geoff, Peter M, Ros, and Trish. The members of this select group have all competed in the "Jinxi Cup", held just outside Shanghai. The remaining players – Ben, David, Karen, Keith and Philip – formed the "Australia 6" team, with 3 states represented.

To take advantage of a development opportunity, each game was played with a different captain. Captains were matched in terms of experience and the two most experienced captains on each team were banned from providing in-game advice.



The Shanghai 6 team stormed to a 3-0 lead, but the Australians fought back, to result in a 3-2 win for the Shanghai 6.

All games were played with great sportsmanship, in particular the team games that were not refereed (although we did have the unusual luxury of four Level 1 referees playing).

A big thank you to all our competitors but particularly our interstate competitors – Philip, Ros and Keith for making the trip, and also to Roger and David for marking the courts, and Lyn for presenting the trophy.

Millswood Croquet club has never won the Open Weekend Pennant, and in fact have only the one Open pennant win back in Autumn 2011.

The 2021 Season kicked off with a close loss to North Adelaide on 6th February. Millswood then won the next five matches, most of the matches were very close, some fortunately were won by a greater hoop count, the only exception was the 5 to 1 win over the highly credentialed and respected Hyde Park Knights on July 3rd.

The last match against Glenunga was delayed due the COVID lockdown and was scheduled for November 14, this was to be the final match in the Weekend Open season. Knowing the Open Pennant standings, the mathematicians at Millswood had deliberated and concluded that we had to win only one of the six games to win the pennant. Glenunga needed to win the match 6-0 to win the pennant.

On match day, with great expectation, there were many Millswood and Glenunga supporters to watch the match unfold. The relative team handicap totals were Millswood 3, Glenunga 18, it would be fair to say that Millswood were quietly confident. But, of course, the match didn't go as expected. Glenunga won the first two doubles matches, then Millswood won three of the next four, tying the match at three games all. Millswood won the match 37 hoops to 32 and more importantly finished on top of the standings, to claim their first ever Weekend Open Pennant. Congratulations to Glenunga for providing outstanding competition on the day, and in particular to Paul Ensor who was in elite form running hoops and roqueting from great distances.

The Millswood 2021 Weekend Open squad comprised Grant Lawrence, Rob Brown, Stewart Kingsborough, Kim Millhouse, Ed Wilson, Barbara Bertram, Julianne Jago and Peter Webster. Alternate Stroke Handicap Doubles

This new event was held over three days, November 2 – 4, 2021. The new format was introduced mainly to provide the opportunity for a more experienced player to partner a lesser experienced player in a mentoring role. The event proved to be very popular and attracted entries from eight pairs. The first day was fairly warm but the second and third days were perfect. It took a little while for the players to get used to the alternate stroke format, with some confusion at the start of the games, but they soon got into the swing of things. Because the order of play had to be adhered to, even between turns as well as between strokes, memories were aided by the use of printed cartoons on cards, which were handed to the next partner to play after a turn ended. By the end of the three days these were not used much as most had got the hang of it by then. It was interesting to see the different styles of play – some studiously contemplating each stroke, others questioning and learning, and one pair, Jim Curtis and Lyn Parnell, playing like a well-oiled machine as though they could read each other's thoughts.

There were three pairs with five wins but Barry Jennings and Karen Magee were the winners with 65 net hoops. It was Karen's first serious foray into AC and, although she claimed she was confused most of the time, she acquitted herself very well under Barry's watchful supervision. Glen Blatchford and Peter Woodward were runners-up with 15 net hoops and Shirley Howlett and Steve Templeton were a very close third with 14 net hoops.

THE MASLEN BROOCH

The Maslen Brooch dates back to 1974 when Mrs. Gertie Maslen of Broadview Croquet Club decided that too many men were winning medals, so she donated funds for the provision of a gold brooch, to be awarded annually for a competition for women only. The current competition is for women with handicaps 6 or more. Some years ago, Jane Lewis donated a badge for men in the same handicap range (the Lewis Badge) and this event is held concurrently with the Maslen Brooch. This year only two men entered so the event was not held.
