SACA Strategic Planning

The Board has decided to formalise our long-term planning with the development of a new Strategic Plan. The current Strategic Plan expired in 2021.

The Board sees this an essential piece of work, to ensure we have a contemporary perspective as we consider our player and club needs. Good governance dictates that it is important to have regard for the wider community who are consumers of recreational and sporting activities.

Gateballers prepare for the Australian Gateball Championships

Gateballers from the Hyde Park Croquet Club are off to the Australian Gateball Championships being played from the 1st to 3rd April 2022 at the Gold Coast Performance Centre.

Gateball has been played at Hyde Park since 2016 but according to Club President and Team Manager, Barry Haydon, this is the first time they have sent a team to the Nationals. While it is a first for many of the team, several members have already played internationally and are looking forward to bringing their skills to the national championships.

The Gold Coast has welcomed the event as 100 Gateballers from across Australia will gather for a doubles event, practice sessions and an opening ceremony on Friday 1st April. The ceremony will conclude by the stroking of a ball through a ceremonial gate to officially open the Championships.

Gateball, sometimes called the 20/20 version of Croquet, is a fast and skillful team game involving 5 players per team trying to outwit and outplay the other team in a 30-minute play fest. Each stroke (or spark) has to be played within 10 seconds! It combines the precision of snooker, with the tactical skills of chess in a game for all ages.

Though relatively unknown in Australia, the game is played by over 10 million people worldwide and is very popular in Asia. The last Australian Championships were held just over two years ago at Cairnlea, Victoria. It ended in a thrilling final between teams from China and Kew (Melbourne). Who knows what this year's event will bring!

Know your Rules—Association Croquet Roger Buddle

Law 28.7 – Failing to play a ball from baulk

This situation arose at the recent Victor Harbor tournament.

Suppose a player is entitled to a lift. She lifts one of her balls and places it at the end of A baulk. On taking her stance, she notices that if she moves her striker ball about two feet to her right she will have a double on two balls further up the court. She moves her ball accordingly and then moves it a bit further to improve her chances. She plays her stroke and roquets one of the balls. Just as she is about to take croquet from the ball she hit, her opponent calls out, "Just a minute; your ball wasn't on the baulk line when you played your shot."

Question: How is this situation resolved?

Answer: The ball that was roqueted is replaced in its original position, and the striker returns her ball to any place on the A baulk (or the B baulk if she so wishes) and plays on.

If the player, having roqueted a ball, had taken croquet and in the croquet stroke her striker ball had passed through one of her hoops in order before her opponent had called out, the croqueted ball would still have to be returned to its original position before it was roqueted. The hoop would not be counted. The player is still entitled to re-play from any place on either baulk.

However, suppose one of the balls went out due to the croquet stroke. In that case, the error is rectified (balls replaced and hoop disallowed), but the striker's turn ends because of the fault of going out on a croquet stroke.

The limit of claims for this non-fatal error is the third stroke of the striker's turn. In other words, if either player does not notice the error before the third stroke, then it is too late, and the striker continues. Any points made are valid.


Know your Rules—Golf Croquet Anne Woodhouse

A ball has been moved from its original position.

A ball may be moved by the weather or even by the court (the ball may be resting on a small mound).

- 1. If moved by weather, replace the ball in its original position. (See rule 9.7)
- 2. If a ball has stopped in a position for at least five seconds before it moves, it is to be replaced in its original position. (See rule 6.4.2 and 6.4.3)

If, however, the ball has been deliberately moved (perhaps to give more of an advantage to its owner) this is a very difficult situation.





If the incident was not observed there is not much you can do. However it is important to let all the players know that you have observed the change in position. In this way, hopefully, it will not happen again.

If it does happen again (surely not!) then a warning can be given to the relevant player for deliberately moving the ball, or, if the player says it was an accident then a warning for not taking care on the court (as it was the second time it has happened). (See rule 16)

IMPORTANT Make sure you do not accuse anyone but keep the conversation polite and good-natured.



SA Men's Championship - Golf Croquet

This competition was played over two days (Saturday 26th and Sunday 27th March), and was hosted by Hyde Park croquet club due to other events being held at SACA Hutt Road.

Initially the competition had a full field of twelve players. Unfortunately, in the preceding weeks, COVID, colds and other events reduced the final field to eight players. The final format of the competition was a single round robin on each day of the competition (7 one-hour games on each day).

After the first day there was a clear leader, but the final outcome could not be guaranteed. With the temperature due to rise on the Sunday, the players in association with the event manager and referees agreed to start play an hour earlier than advertised to avoid the afternoon heat. Interestingly you would expect to finish an hour earlier but that was not the case with the final game finishing at roughly the same time as the previous day.

The 2022 SA GC Men's Champion was Dwayne McCormick (Norwood), winning 13 of his 14 games. Stephen Condous (Hyde Park) was the runner up, winning 11 of his 14 games.
