1. Accounts to 30 April 2022

Balance Sheet

Cash balances total \$200.644, with Current assets totalling \$203,147.

Current liabilities total \$15,387, and so Net assets total \$187,760, up from \$121,349 at 30 June 2021, but down from \$197,102 at 28 February 2022.

Profit and Loss

The Profit and Loss statement is currently showing a surplus of \$66,409 versus a budgeted surplus of \$48,876, a difference of \$17,533.

A summary of variances is provided in the table attached.

A review of pennants and events invoicing has highlighted that some invoicing has been missed and this will be rectified before the next meeting.

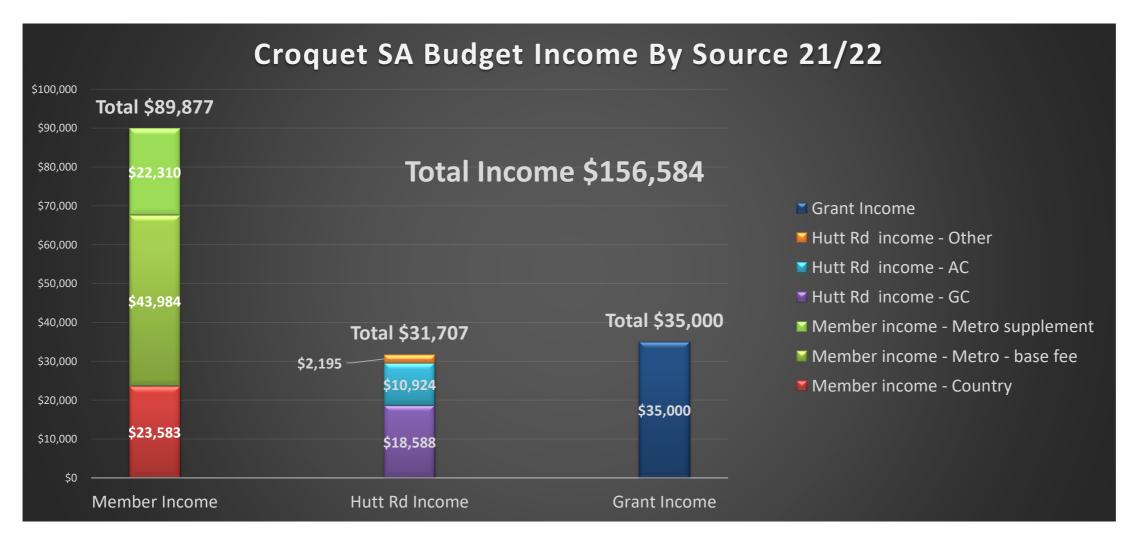
The main change from the last forecast is the \$14,940 of Covid-19 has been removed as it is unlikely these funds will be spent before 30 June, and that they will noty be used for costs that we would have incurred anyway.

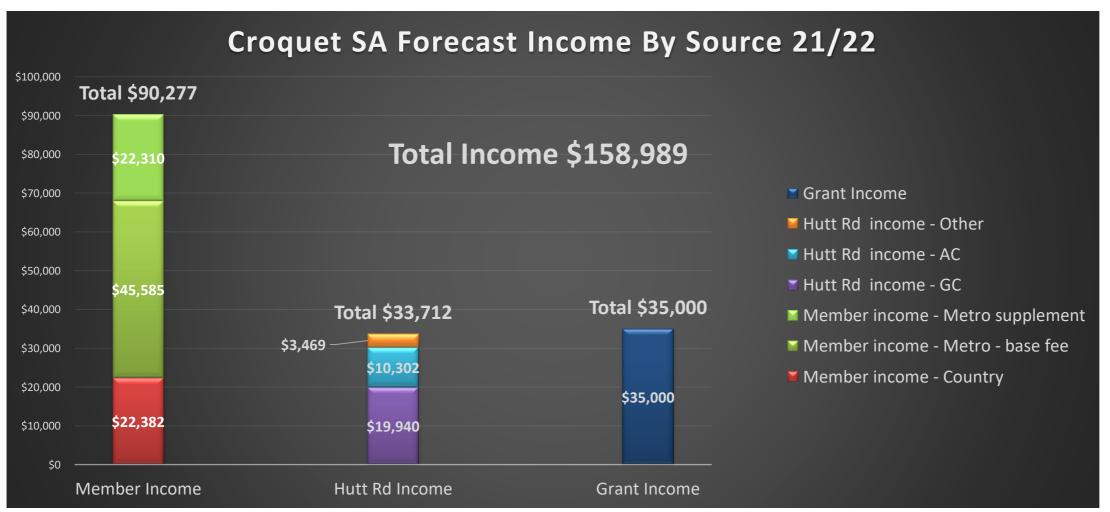
This has been more than offset by underspends in, mainly coaching, refereeing, travel and admin costs being recognised as permanent differences rather than timing differences.

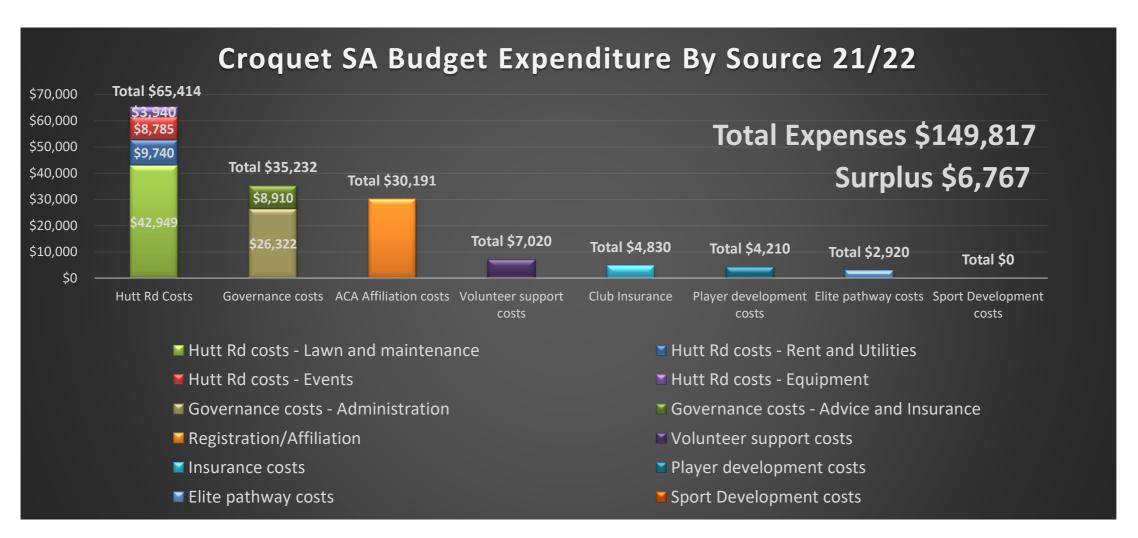

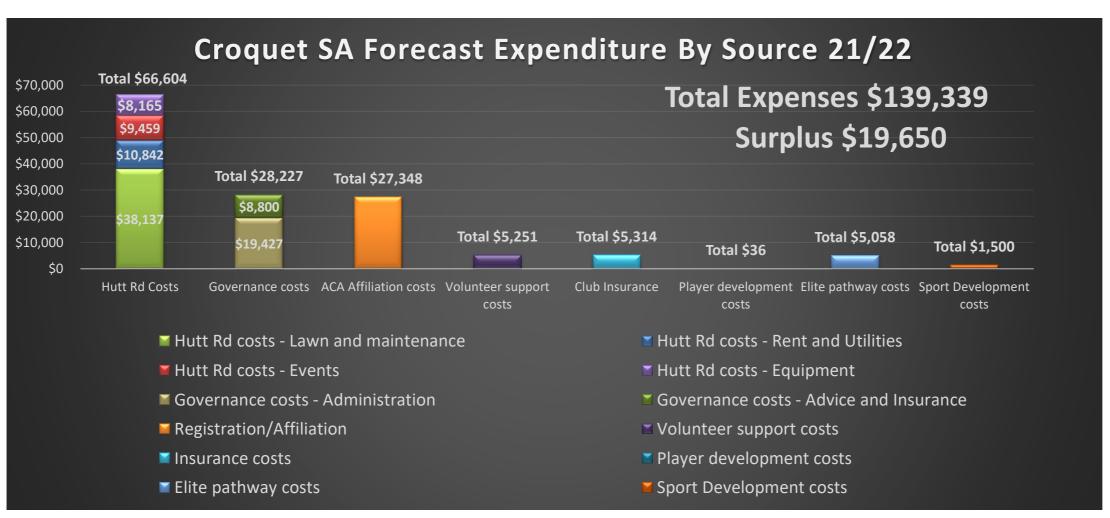
The budget graphs have also been attached, together with the equivalent year end forecast graphs, based on the impact of the permanent variances identified above.

Golf Croquet Director's Report For April 20232

This is my first report as the newly appointed GC Director.

Attended and chaired my first GC Committee meeting at Hyde Park Croquet Club.

A range of topics were discussed and most notably of these I wish to bring back to the Board for further discussion and or direction.

- The GC Committee would like to know if the Board would like to see the committee's minutes or is the Board happy to review the prominent points in the GC Director's report?
- The State Handicapper should be able to override Club Handicapper if an inappropriate handicap has been given to a player.
- As Greg Rowberry was South Australia's representative at the State
 Discussion Forum is there any information that the GC Committee should
 have or know?
- At the recent Eyre Cup, commentators were heard to say that the new tops
 the South Australian players were wearing did not have enough red on the
 tops. South Australia is known to have red on their uniforms. One suggestion
 was to have the words South Australia printed in red on the back of the tops. I
 would request that this is approved by the Board.
- The GC Committee have decided that it will still require dedicated Covid
 Marshalls at all Croquet SA's events. It has been noted that dedicated Covid
 Marshalls have made a big improvement getting players and visitors to scan
 in and remain the required distances apart. However, this requirement will not
 be enforced.
- Information as requested by the Board was passed onto Geoff Crook re the need for more lawns.
- A more formal program for the maintenance at Hutt Road for Mr Watchman and hoop set up would be appreciated, so that hopefully more three day GC events could be held at Hutt Road.

The GC SA Men's Championship was held at Hyde Park Croquet Club over two days in March. It was a very well organised event with thanks to the referees, Karen Magee, Julianne Jago, Bernie Pfitzner, Kim Millhouse and to Peter Martyniuk for organising, being scorer and running around getting supplies when they ran out.

Golf Croquet Director's Report to the Board

11 May 2022

- Chaired the Golf Croquet Committee in April 2022.
- Four South Australian members have gone to Cairnlea to play in the Australian Singles and the Doubles competition. They are Karen Magee, Barry Haydon, Barry Jennings and Stephen Condous.

Karen and Barry J finished in the doubles in 7th place and Barry H and Stephen finished in 6th place.

Karen and Barry J finished in 3rd in the Play-off Knock-out.

Barry H and Stephen were beaten in the Y-Event Semi-finals.

- Karen and Barry J finished 1st in the Plate.
- The singles are underway with all members showing very good results.
- The new 6th Edition Rule Books are to be released at the end of the month (May).
 There is a new Rule 20 entitled Advantage Play. This is another form of handicap
 play. Instead of having free shots the lower handicap players will be given free
 hoops.
- As a result of this inclusion in the Rule book I have sent emails to all clubs encouraging them to trial the new form of croquet and have offered to go to clubs and explain how it will work.
- I have also asked the events coordinator to assist in arranging a tournament for all players using the new format, Advantage Golf Croquet.
- I have attended the Interstate Shield Sub committee and we are having a meeting with representatives of the clubs to be involved in hosting the various competitions.
- I have attended the Referee sub committee and are working hard to identify and train possible new referee that will be needed during the ISS.

Most current referees are expected to be playing in the various tournaments leaving us with a very severe shortage of local referees.

- Two main items to be addressed by the Board are:
 - To send a letter to the Governor of South Australia to see if he can host the Reception at Government House, and
 - Discuss whether AC and GC can have more equitable use of the courts at Hutt Road
