New GC Rules Start 1st July 2022 - Anne Woodhouse

The rules have changed again but this time nothing much has changed.

To get you started, you need to know that when you toss for the start of the game you now have the choice of starting first or second. Whoever goes first plays with the Blue and Black balls and whoever goes second (even if you have won the toss) plays with the Red and Yellow balls.

Another rule change is for **successive ball play.** Eg Blue plays (correct ball) and then Black plays (not their turn). Blue's stroke stands and Black's is annulled (as if it had not happened) ie Black is put back where it was (and any balls it may have hit) and then the correct ball (Red) is played. Black then plays ie does not miss a turn.

M E Hatwell Gold Medal


The Hatwell Gold Medal is for players with handicaps of three or more. You can read the history behind the M E Hatwell gold medal on the Croquet SA website under History/Medal History. The event for 2022 was held on Tuesday 21st and Wednesday 22nd of June.

The competition attracted six entrants; of the six, four were from the country, two travelling from Tumby Bay (Garry Speed and Terry Catling), one from Kadina (Malcolm Kinch) and one from Victor Harbor (Shirley Howlett). The other two were Liz Mackenzie and James Temlett.

The format was a single round-robin over the two days, with two games on the first day and three on the second day. The weather, considering the time of the year, was not too bad, with just a few showers. Unfortunately, James Temlett was not well after the first day and had to withdraw.

Three games were drawn when the bell rang and decided on the next hoop, and Terry Catling reduced his handicap to 4.5 after his first game. The overall winner was Shirley Howlett, who won all her games, and the runner-up was Garry Speed.

The two day Autumn Singles Tournament for 5+ handicaps was held at Hutt Road on the 17th and 31 May.


A small but competitive field of six players vied to pull back an early lead by Russell Agardi from Millswood after the first day.

Wallaroo Croquet Club

The Wallaroo CC is unique in that it is part of The Wallaroo Community Sporting Clubs complex. They share the facilities with a huge Bowls club and Golf Club. They have about 12 members and take their turn working mainly in the kitchen for events that the Community Club hosts in the large entertainment area.

The Wallaroo ladies do have a home advantage playing on the artificial lawn but find it very difficult to hit the ball hard enough when playing on grass. Of course, the obvious benefit of an artificial surface is that no watering or cutting is required, however some maintenance is necessary and Secretary Jacqui Riley and Club Captain Di Paull have taken this task on board. The surface has been down for 11 years and is starting to show signs of age, with mould being a major problem especially on Lawn 1 which does not get much sunshine. The question of replacing the lawn at an approximate cost of \$180,000 is a discussion they will be having with the Centre's Management Committee in the near future.

They play Association Croquet and have been able to field two teams in the NYPCA Pennants. Wallaroo White were Runners Up in this year's competition, well done ladies! They have a group of 'social players' who gather on Thursday evenings and are trying to get them interested in coming to their daytime practices. It's really quite amazing to have three croquet clubs in such a small geographical area, all with different challenges and identities.

The Wallaroo ladies would make you very welcome at their club and you would soon find out exactly how much control you have of the ball! Wallaroo is a port town and it's interesting watching the boats and also the cargo ships which collect the grain and take it overseas. There is also a ferry which goes to Lucky Bay on the Eyre Peninsula and it is good fun watching it berth, especially when it hits the jetty! The main street has several cafes and a very popular 'Bond Store' which serves up various blends of Gin along with other beverages and food. Like all of the Yorke Peninsula the population is growing rapidly with new developments and it's lovely driving around The Marina and looking at all the different styles of houses. North Beach is a truly great place to sit and watch the sun go down and you can drive your car onto the beach so no need to lug heavy seats and picnic stuff. Wallaroo has a rich maritime history which is showcased in the Nautical Museum. The Copper Triangle is well worth a visit and throw in a game or 3 of croquet, what could be better!
