Discussion:

1. Accounts to 30 June 2022

Balance Sheet

Cash balances total \$200,231, with Current assets totalling \$203,772.

Current liabilities total \$58,361, and so Net assets total \$145,410, up from \$121,349 at 30 June 2021, but down from \$187,760 at 30 April 2022.

This includes an accrual for ACA registration fees of approx. \$29,000 as we are still awaiting an invoice, together with approximately \$12,000 in respect of the Covid-19 grant received recently.

Profit and Loss

The Profit and Loss statement is currently showing a surplus of \$24,061 versus a budgeted surplus of \$6,767, a difference of \$17,294.

A summary of variances is provided in the table attached.

2. ATO issue

An issue has arisen where a supplier's ABN was cancelled, and so we should have been deducting tax from payments to this suppler. This has been disclosed to the ATO with the result that the ATO will take no further action, provided future payments have the appropriate tax deducted. The supplier has elected to discontinue servicing SACA and a final payment has been made with the appropriate tax deduction.

3. Year End

Most year end procedures have been completed, with all payroll reports done and the BAS lodged. Outstanding items are a report on payments made to suppliers with no ABN and arrangements for the year end audit.
