Neil Bennett White (23/4/43 - 20/7/22)

The Brighton Croquet Club is mourning the loss of our club member and player Neil Bennett White. Neil passed away on the 20th of July aged 79 years. He will be sadly missed by his loving wife Heather, also a croquet player, and his family. Neil started playing Association croquet at South Terrace. He also was a member at Holdfast Bay for a time before joining Brighton.

Neil embraced Golf Croquet in the early years of its establishment as a competitive national sport.

He was selected as a team member for the inaugural GC State team competition in 2007 and represented SA again in 2012 and 2013. He was a qualified referee and coach for many years and he was extremely supportive of new players to croquet. Neil was president of SACA from 2009 to 2011 and was instrumental in convincing SACA to bid for the world AC champion-

ships in 2012.

When the ISS was held in Adelaide for the first time in 2014 Neil

was the Tournament Manager and he was also President of the ACA council from 2013 to 2015. Neil was a member of the group established to promote U/21 participation at SACA and also supported the ACA push for the same.

He was also known for telling "Dad" jokes and his flamboyant dress sense, often wearing colourful jackets and ties.

Inspired by recent events at the All England Lawn Tennis and Croquet Club, six courageous ladies and six valiant gentlemen braved the wintery elements at Hutt Road, Adelaide on the 16th and 17th of July to take part in the Selectors' Invitation event for potential State Team players.

The Ladies block included Sally Harper and Tracy Sincock who were both members of the 2022 State Team that travelled to Sydney to take part in the inter-State Eire Cup competition in March. Other "potentials" were Liz Mackenzie and Di Helier as well as recent golf croquet State Player and convert to Association Croquet, Karen Magee. Tumby Bay player Karyn Speed was thrown in the deep-end but performed admirably despite her relative lack of experience.

The "Gentlemen's" block also had two players from the 2022 State Team - Mark Senior and Barry Jennings. The "Potentials" were Roger Buddle, Glen Blatchford, Philip Wise and Tumby Bay emerging talent, Garry Speed. Garry recently finished runner up in the SACroquet Hatwell (3+) event, was a convincing first in 'C' block in the Tumby Bay Tournament in May and first in Block 2 at Naracoorte in May. Both days started under very fresh conditions and, on Saturday, play was carried on without interruption despite the odd short burst of heavy rain.

Sunday morning was more serious with lakes formed on Lawn 1 and very mushy conditions on Lawns 1 and 2. Play commenced a little late on Sunday to allow time to squeegee Lawn 1 and was halted briefly for more squeegeeing after another mid-morning shower. Fortunately, the rain eased after this and all games were played out.

The final result was a convincing win to Sally Harper who went undefeated (5 wins) in the Ladies event. Runner-up was Liz Mackenzie (3 wins, +19 hoops) from Di Helier (3 wins, -1 hoop), Tracey Sincock (2 wins) and Karen Magee and Karyn Speed, each with one win.

A similar situation in the Gentlemen's event with Barry Jennings surviving some close games to go undefeated. Mark Senior was runner-up with 3 wins (+25 hoops) from Glen Blatchford (3 wins, -19 hoops), Roger Buddle (2 wins), Garry Speed (2 wins) and Philip Wise.

All in all, a memorable and sociable event, played in good spirits that entertained a small band of enthusiastic spectators.

I was very pleased when Virginia emailed me to say that the Millicent CC had sent them a flier for their Gala Day in March and inviting the Mt Gambier players to come. This is the sort of communication and cooperation that needs to happen in order that the game of croquet, no matter which code, builds up and thrives especially in regional areas where players have to drive long distances.

I want to thank Virginia, Leah, Pat and Joy for their warm and friendly welcome and I look forward to my next visit and hearing all about the progress that is being made. I've just been notified that 4 new members have joined in the last 2 months and that 8 players are travelling to Portland to play Aussie, Golf and Ricochet (which they have just begun playing) and that they hope to start up a regular visiting system with them every month or so.

The Mt Gambier CC is also hoping to host the 2024 Masters Games. The future looks very positive for this 'go ahead' club and as we all know success breeds success! Well done to everyone involved!
