Brighton Armstrong Challenge 2022

We had a top field including top players in the state and members of the State Team for both the Women's and Men's events of the Brighton Armstrong Challenge held on 4 to 7 August. The "Armstrong" is open to everyone and we had two 7 handicappers also enter (with trepidation) but they did so well they were both 6 handicappers by the end of the tournament!

The women's event was fairly even, with results of games very hard to predict. However, having said that, the top two ranked players, Kate Logan from Victor Harbor and Karen Magee from Brighton ended up contesting the final. Kate began well by surging ahead and beating Karen 7-1 in the first game of three. But Karen is never down for long and came back to eventually win the next two games and win the Women's Tournament for the third time.



The men's event was blessed with

better weather and they took advantage of it. Once again the top two ranked players, Dwayne McCormick from Norwood and Stephen Condous from Hyde Park, contested the final with Dwayne promising a "show". Well he certainly delivered to win the second game and the match. He was two hoops down with very little time to go. He ran hoop nine then tried to run hoop ten from one end to the other with both of his balls. He was successful with his second attempt. Now at 5 all time was no longer a factor. He then finished the game off by doing a spectacular in-off from the boundary, hitting his own ball, bouncing in the air and then through the hoop!

The spectators certainly got their money's worth over all four days of play.

The Brighton Armstrong Challenge, established in 2015, is named after Tom and Jean Armstrong, a couple who had a huge impact on croquet, not only at the Brighton Croquet Club but throughout South Australia and Australia. They introduced thousands of people to croquet and trained many State Team and international players.





Queensland State Gateball Competition

This year I attended my first Queensland State Gateball competition at Southport Croquet Club on the Gold Coast. The teams event was held on Friday 12 and Saturday 13 August 2022, with the doubles event following on 14 and 15 August.

I played with Canberra in the team's event which was contested in a round-robin format between 9 teams. After close of play on Friday, Canberra topped the leader board with 5 wins from 5 games, and as it turned out needing only one win on Saturday to take out the trophy. Unfortunately, the weather turned on Saturday, and we lost all 3 games and finished in 3rd place behind the local Grey Shirts team from Moreton Bay, and the MACS from NSW.

Sunday ushered in sunshine and perfect Gateball conditions. My doubles partner was Jenny from the winning MACS team, and we entered our first game in high spirits. We lost 18-9, but undaunted won most of the rest of our games that day to end up with 4 wins and 2 losses, in contention with 3 other teams in our block. Our two games on Monday were both



against tough opponents – Canberra and the Wanderers [runners up in last year's NSW State doubles comp]. We managed to win both games and top our block. After winning our semi-final, we were up against Southport pair Lee and Julia, who beat us on countback in our block game, by scoring Agari on the last turn.



Our opponents had an unfortunate start, putting their first three balls out of play, which allowed us to control the game, although we again had a scare on the last turn. Lightning didn't strike twice and we emerged victorious.

The tournament was very well organised and played in a good spirit and I would like to thank all involved.
