2022 SACA Life Member—Shirley Carr

Shirley began playing croquet in 1980 in her home town of Tumby Bay. It didn't take long before she was selected in the South Australian State team and remained as a member for the next 18 consecutive years.

SA were very successful in the Eire Cup during this time. The women were extremely strong and Shirley represented Australia in Trans Tasman events many times in a period where this event was only for women.

Shirley won the Australian Women's Singles in 1990, 1993 and 1997 and was runner up a number of times.

In addition Shirley won many tournaments including the Armstrong and only a couple of years ago when over 80 years of age, Shirley beat a top field to win the Victor Harbor tournament.

When Shirley was a State team member it was a pre requisite that all players were qualified referees. Shirley has not only engaged in refereeing over her career but also coaching and is recognised as a great tactician of the game.

Shirley was awarded the Australian Sports Medal for her sporting achievements.

In addition to Shirley's outstanding playing career, Shirley has volunteered her time in a number of administrative roles at Club level. Shirley was Victor Harbor Club Captain and a Committee member for 4 years, Club Secretary at Tumby Bay for 9 years and President at Tumby for 3 - a total of 16 years committed to administering the sport.



Not only an outstanding croquet player and administrator, Shirley continues to work in the club gardens at Tumby and if you ever attend the Tumby tournaments will enjoy her delicious sponge rolls.

Shirley is truly a legend of our game and thoroughly deserving of receiving honorary Life Membership.



SA State Gateball Tournament

The SA State Gateball Tournament was held from Friday 2 December 2022 to Sunday 4 December 2022, and was a testament to the flexibility, pragmatism and all round good nature of the Gateball community.

It was gratifying to see 6 teams enter the competition, with 3 local sides and 3 interstate teams from Victoria, NSW and ACT.

We started with doubles on Friday, teams on Saturday, and completion of doubles on Sunday. This unusual schedule arose due to

some players

not being available on Friday, and some team-only players who could only play on Saturday.

The President's [doubles] Trophy was contested over two blocks of six pairs, with the Brighton team having an excellent Friday to lead Block A with 4 wins from 4 games, and it was a similar story in Block B with Canberra Long Shots also winning all four of their games.

Saturday saw the arrival of the Victorian team . Kew [and co] played to their usual standard, despite being more of a composite team, and will be the first team to adorn the new Gateball Teams perpetual trophy.



Canberra placed second with 3 wins, separated from Woodville, ably supported by Ros and Maddi Crowe from Queensland,



in third place by net gates. [Can I say Well done Woodville? Just did I guess.]

Sunday again brought hot weather and a tough schedule for the pairings of Philip and Peter W; and Elaine and Cheryl, who had to play all of their games on Sunday morning.

A tense finale was in store with 3 teams in each block in contention as the last round started. Philip and Peter beat Brighton 21-

9 which unfortunately consigned Brighton to third place in Block A, but still a great performance from the Brighton pair in their first tournament. Elaine and Cheryl won their final Block B game but also placed third in their block, which set up semi finals between Philip and Peter versus John and Penny and Canberra Long Shots versus the Hyde Park pair. It was great to see a local doubles team make the finals and the Hyde Park pairing should be congratulated on their performance. Canberra were too strong, and the final was played between Canberra and Philip and Peter [also from Canberra]. Philip again will have his name etched onto the trophy after a 14-8 victory.

The weekend also provided an opportunity for a number of people to sit their Referee Theory exam. Congratulations to Cheryl, Peter W and Ralph for passing the level 1 Referee Theory exam. Barry Jennings and Maddi Crowe also passed the theory exam and were assessed for the practical component, and are to be congratulated on becoming our newest Level 1 referees.

A big thank you to Gary Maher for his outstanding organisation over the three days. Thanks also to Barry Haydon for facilitating a late venue change, Peter Martyniuk for his support during the event, and Ros Crowe for stepping in when I overslept! Vale Bryan Dawson

Bryan was a skilled craftsman and, before purchasing the croquet equipment manufacturing business from Bill Smith in the early 1980's had followed in the footsteps of his father and learned the value of being a perfectionist as a wood turner, cabinet maker and furniture restorer – skills he continued to practice until very late in life. He had had not previously been a croquet player and, initially, took up the game in order to promote his business.

Both Bryan and Colin Pickering were two of my early mentors at the Mt Barker Croquet Club in the 1990's and I regularly played doubles with Bryan. He was an entertaining instructor and always had a witty or



cheeky comment. Some of the more memorable ones were "go smack it in the guts," or "try it, and you'll never die wondering."

Well Bryan tried it. With the same meticulous approach that he applied to his wood craft he practiced regularly – mostly by going out and repeatedly hitting roquets. He advanced quickly through the croquet ranks with one of his first significant victories being the 1987 ME Hatwell Gold. The following year he competed in the Australian Open and, in 1990, commenced a run of 16 straight years as a member of the South Australian Inter-State Eire Cup team. During this period he also won numerous State events including the ACA Bronze Medal in 2006, the President's Trophy (3 times) and the SA Open in 2001 and 2004. He, along with several other long-serving State Team members was awarded Player Life Membership in the early 2000's.

No doubt, the highlight of Bryan's playing career was his selection in the Australian MacRobertson Shield Team that played at Christchurch, New Zealand in 2000 against teams from England, New Zealand and the USA. One of his proudest achievements was defeating the highly ranked Englishman, Stephen Mulliner, in a best-of-3 match in that event.

But Bryan's greatest contribution to the international game of croquet (and to the success of his business) was his development of the ubiquitous Dawson Ball. The World Croquet Federation acknowledged this contribution in 2019 when he was nominated to the WCF Hall of Fame. The WCF website states:

At his Adelaide workshop he undertook years of painstaking research in the precise mix of plastics and colours required for the cold moulding process that would produce a croquet ball that met the specifications reliably by being perfectly round, robust enough to withstand years of vigorous use and almost entirely resilient to temperature changes"

I recall visiting Bryan's workshop in the early 2000's where he showed me the metal master ball that he had hand-crafted as the mould for every single Dawson ball that had been made. Each spike on the mould was exactly positioned to provide the milling pattern that all croquet players have become familiar with. The creation of this master ball had taken years of trial and error and attention to detail. I was also staggered by the finishing process which involved placing the newly moulded the balls, no more than half a dozen at a time, into a very small, normal looking kitchen oven to cure. After curing they were removed from the mould and individually hand-trimmed to ensure no ridges where the two halves of the balls were joined – an exacting process requiring skill and great patience when you consider the scale at which these balls were now being distributed around the world.

Bryan was a character – entertaining, ever cheerful, and supportive. He loved his toys – his Ford F350 "Fifth Wheeler" with hitch installation to tow his 5 Star caravan – a true measure of his business success. After retiring and selling the ball manufacturing business in 2017 he travelled regularly to the Riverland and South East to visit family and old friends. He continued to make croquet equipment and renovate furniture as a favour for friends and family and produced an unbelievable collection of powerful and beautifully produced crossbows.

He will be remembered well by the croquet fraternity. Greg Rowberry

Millswood Celebrates 100 years of Croquet

On Sunday November 27th Millswood croquet club celebrated its 100 years of croquet.

On September 29th, 1922, a general meeting was held at the Goodwood institute by 12 enterprising women and the Millswood croquet club was formed. Subscriptions were 35 shillings per year.

In 1924 Rule 3 was adopted which said the membership was to be exclusively for ladies. It was not until 1968 rule 3 was amended allowing men to join.



Our celebration on Sunday was a grand affair as we also had the opening of our new clubhouse.

The theme was 1922 garden party, and the grounds were decorated with 300 meters of bunting in the ball colours, and many tubs of flowers in the colours of our club, Blue and yellow.

Some of our members dressed up in the 1920's style of clothing.

A group of women from the Victoriana Association came in Edwardian costume lead by Merran Walsh which added to the colour of the festivities.

Our president Stewart Kingsborough introduced Jayne Stinson the Member for Badcoe who cut the ribbon to the new club house and assisted by Michael Hewison the Mayor for Unley cut the cake.

Jayne and Michael presented a bouquet to each of the members who joined the club in the last century, Jane Sharley 1980, Jane Lewis 1983, Lois Wilson 1996, Barbara Gordon 1999. All these women have contributed greatly to the advance of croquet and our club.

A demonstration of croquet was played with Kim Millhouse involving Jayne Stinson, Michael Hewison and several of our neighbours that came to enjoy the festivities as well.



We now look forward to the next 100 years.

Colin Pickering North Adelaide Games 2022 results







These annual Games, held in November each year, comprise two main tournaments. One is the **Invitation Singles**, where the North Adelaide Croquet Club invites a limited number of top male and female players to compete in a Round Robin competition over a weekend (and sometimes the preceding Friday evening). Entry fees allow for prizes for the Winner and Runner-Up in each of the Men's and Women's competitions, and the Men's and Women's winners names are added to a shield hanging in the NACC clubroom. The second is the **Swiss Singles**, scheduled over three days, where players of any handicap can nominate to enter, and compete in four games against others around the same handicap. With handicaps weighted accordingly, every player has a fair chance of winning this event. Again, prizes are presented, this time for the Championship Winner and Runner-Up as well as for the Handicap Winner and Runner-Up.

This year, we were very fortunate that largely fine weather greeted the players for each event! The tournaments were played in excellent spirit and some very fine croquet was on show for many interested onlookers.

Invitation Singles

This tournament was conducted on 25-27 November. Nine men and six women participated – seven from country clubs. The men's tournament was exciting with the results hanging in the balance until the end and winners decided by net hoops which were very close. Three won 6 games (and three won 5 games)! The three with 6 wins, in order, were Tim O'Leary (Coobowie, +69 net hoops), David Short (Norwood, +67 net hoops) and Mark Senior (Hyde Park, +65 net hoops). In the women's tournament, Robyn Short (Coobowie) was the winner with 5 wins (+63 net hoops), while the runner-up was Di Helier (Norwood) with 3 wins, and third was Shirley Howlett (Victor Harbor) with 2 wins. **Swiss Singles**

In this event held on 16-18 November, 20 players over a range of handicaps (from 1 to 18) participated, six from country clubs. In the *Championship*, the winner was Kevin Le Poidevin (North Adelaide) who was the only player to win all 4 games, while the Runner-up was Barry Jennings (Hyde Park) with 3 wins. In the *Handicap*, the winner was Greg Rowberry (Norwood) and the runner-up Tracey Sincock (Hyde Park). Other players with 3 wins included Rhonda Habner (Tumby Bay), Liz Mackenzie (Norwood) and Barry Jennings (Hyde Park).

We congratulate all these worthy winners – Tim, David, Robyn, Di, Kevin, Barry, Greg and Tracey. My sincere thanks to all participating players who made the tournaments such a success, and to all those North Adelaide Croquet Club members, who helped to feed players, provide excellent playing surfaces, set hoops each day and ensure the Games ran smoothly. We greatly look forward to conducting the North Adelaide Games again in November next year.
