The South Australia croquet fraternity was very saddened to hear of Ken Zadow's passing. Ken was a truly valued and respected Life Member of the Murray Bridge Croquet Club. I quite clearly remember, while sitting with his wife Lesley at a tournament, Ken announcing 'I'm not going to start croquet till I'm 80!!' We had such a laugh. Well, that's exactly what he did and he turned out to be pretty good at it.

Malcolm and I were pleased that we could attend his funeral on 24th March and what a tribute it was to Ken. The funeral and celebration of his life was held in the Christ Church Lutheran Church which holds a special place in the Zadow family history. It is where Ken's parents were married, Ken was baptised, Ken and Lesley tied the knot 64 years ago and now this beautiful church once again was central to the Zadow family and friends.



As a tremendous testament to Ken's life and lifelong involvement with many organisations, the church was totally packed with over 300 attending and the hall had to be used to accommodate this huge number of friends and family who genuinely wanted to be there to farewell a very special person. The number of organisations that Ken was a central part of are too numerous to mention here and after the funeral service, they all gathered together with the Rotary Club to form a Guard of Honour. As the cortege slowly drove out of the church grounds, there was a spontaneous round of applause from everyone in honour of Ken, Lesley was very touched by this simple acknowledgement.

The Zadow carpentry business which Ken built up and ran for 40 years was an 'iconic' enterprise which not only featured highly in the Murray Bridge area but its tentacles spread throughout the state. Ken was renowned for the high quality of his workmanship. Members of the Murray Bridge Croquet Club were in attendance all looking very fresh and sporty in their uniforms and several other croquet players were also pleased to be able to be there and pay their respects.

The overpowering message conveyed was that the long life that Ken lived, overcoming many obstacles along the way, was built on a strong foundation and filled with selfless service and devotion to everyone and everything that he was part of. A gentle giant who will be greatly missed by many, many people.

A great life well lived.



### SACA AC Handicap Doubles (12+ Combined) 21-23 March 2023 - Roger Harris

What an absorbing tournament! Recently at Hutt Road, nine pairs fought out in fine spirit matches against each other – eight games over three days, each game a minimum of 2½ hours – in perfect weather. Most pairs involved one experienced AC player on low handicap teamed with one less experienced AC player on a much higher handicap, and bisques could be taken only by the higher handicapped player. All this made for very interesting competition.

There are three intriguing aspects to note. First, many of the higher handicapped players were in fact GC players in various stages of learning the AC version of croquet and being assisted in their stroke plays and strategies by their more experienced partners. The GC players played very well indeed, and congratulations to all of them.

Second, the final scores in most games were very, very close, resulting in many exciting and tight finishes! Third, no pairs 'pegged out' (maximum 26): only four pairs scored more than 20, again making for relatively low scoring games and tight finishes.



The eventual winners were Barry Jennings and Karen Magee (7 wins, +41 net hoops) and runners-up, decided only in the final round, were Joan Kelly and David Pinnock (5 wins, +17 net hoops). Two other pairs also had 5 wins: Steve Templeton and Bridie O'Reilly (+5 net hoops) and Kevin Le Poidevin and Roger Harris (+2 net hoops). Four pairs won 3 games and one pair 2 games.

The tournament was expertly set up by Events Coordinator Joan Kelly – grateful appreciation to her – and the actual event managed by North Adelaide Croquet Club. #### Meet The SACA Board Members—Lorraine Smith

My parents both played croquet at Millswood club and pressured me to join them for several years. I finally caved in roughly 20 years ago when my father guit the sport and passed on his shirt, trousers, marker holder, hat and mallet to me, making the start more affordable. I was privileged to have early coaching from Jane Lewis and still have her voice in my head when I play, particularly in relation to the etiquette of the game.

Initially I played AC, and it is still my first love, but I've also played a bit of GC and have recently been introduced to gateball. I'm happy when I have a mallet in my hands and love the camaraderie with other players from all around the state.

My father was a Methodist minister which meant we moved house every year or two when I was young. I started playing netball in Nairne when I was about 8 years old and it was my primary sport and great love until a back condition forced me to quit at 35 years of age. I also played tennis, basketball, hockey, softball, court cricket, squash and ten pin bowling, and was a competitive swimmer and lifesaver for a number of years. If anyone asked me to play I tried any sport.

My work career only began after my children started school, when my love of mathematics led me to a university degree in maths and stats. While studying I picked up some casual work at student enrolments which led to short term employment contracts, then a permanent position as HECS and Fees Officer at Flinders University. After 6 years there I moved on to manage the information team at SATAC (South Australian Tertiary Admissions Centre) supporting applicants for university and TAFE. I stayed in that role for 14 years before transitioning to Business Manager at SATAC.

As Business Manager I was primarily responsible for managing all aspects of our finances, with the CEO, building on the skills that are needed for the role of Treasurer in any organisation. While I was still working full time I was approached to consider becoming the Treasurer for SACA and served in that role for about 2 years. Despite believing that it's never a good idea to return to a previous position I was moved

to nominate as Treasurer for another two years to help

keep our sport alive.

I have been a volunteer in varying capacities since my early teens when my father encouraged me to sell badges for charity on a regular basis. There followed committee, coaching and refereeing roles for netball; management of a community toy library including recruiting other volunteers, managing expenditure, stocktake and producing an annual budget; various roles at my children's schools in the classroom, in the library, on committees and managing the soccer program; 22 years as volunteer statistician at Sturt Football Club; and many other activities along the way. I am currently still the statistician for the football club and Treasurer for Millswood Croquet Club, Voices of Boothby and SACA.

I'm fortunate to have two wonderful sons, two lovely daughters-in-law and 7 grandchildren, and get to spend time with the grandchildren every week. Family, the Sturt Football Club and croquet are my passions, but now having a partner who is addicted to mallet sports has increased my participation and added gateball to my interests.
