# 2024 Eire Cup— AC Interstate Shield

This year's Eire cup was contested in Tasmania. The croquet lawns were presented beautifully and I estimate an average speed of 10.5 to 11 seconds. Croquet Tasmania did an excellent job in organising the whole event. They certainly made it easy to organise our team, even though we were at split venues. The format for the Eire Cup is 4 mixed double games followed by 4 ranked singles then reversed singles for both the men and women. A total of 20 games per test. Well, what a year for SA. After a fantastic effort from the team, we came 2nd.

On day 1, we played Queensland. Starting with doubles, we won all four games. It goes to show how im-

portant a good start is as the Queensland women came back strong winning 3 from 4 games. The SA men played well winning all 4 singles. Again the Queensland women played well winning 3 from 4 singles. The second round of men's singles was much more even with the score at 2 all. At the end of the day, we won the test 12 games to 8. Day 2 against WA, saw another great start from the team. We won all our doubles. The team was a bit more settled and it showed in our final scores. We had a convincing victory of 16 games to 4.

Day 3. We were up against Victoria. The strongest team on paper. After the doubles, we were 3-1 down. The first round of singles was a tough battle. Our women only won 1 from 4 but the men rallied and won 3 from 4. Going into the last round of singles the score was 7-5 to the Vics. With 8 singles to go, we certainly gave ourselves a chance. At the end of the day, the Vics kept their 2 game lead to defeat SA 11-9. Again the result showed how important the doubles are.

Day 4. Another tough day, this time against NSW. After the doubles the score was 2 games each. The NSW women played very strong winning 3 from 4 singles and our men evened the

ledger by winning 3 from 4. So after the doubles and first round of singles the score was tied at 6 games apiece. The SA women fought well and won 2 from 4 singles. It was really tight.

The men's games were tough. Playing on bowls courts that were 80% dirt. It could have gone either way but we managed to get 3 from 4 games to win the day 11 games to 9.

Day 5. Mathematically, we still had a chance to win the Eire Cup. We needed NSW to thrash the Vics, and for us to thrash Tasmania. The Tassies came out strong and won 3 from 4 doubles. Our backs were against the wall. The Vics had a good lead on NSW so we were fighting for the silver medal. Our women fought hard and won 3 from 4 and our men followed

also winning 3 from 4. In the last round of singles we could not relax. We needed to win the day to secure second place. The men played well and won 3 from 4 followed by a strong performance from the women to also win 3 from 4.

Second Place and silver was ours.

I am very proud of our team, especially the way everyone supported each other. As the Captain, I could not have asked more from a great bunch of people, who stayed positive and fought every battle with gusto and respect.

Maybe next year SA, maybe next year .

## Jake's Croquet Story

It all started with a teenager frequently riding his bike slowly, stopping and watching croquet play at the 2023 SA Masters Games held at Kadina. Club members involved in education recognised Jake, a student from Kadina Memorial School and invited him in to watch. From this Jake attended and watched many sessions in play, he was intrigued in the game and its equipment. Jake was born with Tetrasomy 9p, a very rare chromosomal imbalance, which has impacted on his general development. He is very social, keen to connect with others, has good sporting skills but finds it challenging to connect all aspects of a sporting game. Given his interest, contact was made with the school resulting in two mainstream disability classes, with the guidance of keen club members, participating in an extended program to learn and play croquet.

Jake has thrived playing Golf Croquet. With each shot his playing partner can gently remind him of fundamentals like feet placement and shot selection which has enabled him to authentically participate and improve his skills.



Jake has now left school, has a part time volunteer position at Community Sports Centre and is excited to play croquet with a small group of members on Monday morning practice sessions.

He has his own mallet and cover now, which he loves to show others, is ready the night before and awake early, waiting to ride his bike to the club. He's become an avid weather watcher, checking frequently that it won't be too hot and he will be able to play. After playing he calls his family to share news of the game.

Jake is one of 22 students that participated in the pilot project that started in July 2023 to introduce croquet to the special needs Kapyong Unit. Each student has a story to tell, and each student within their own capacity benefited from the project. The photo below shows a very happy bunch of students, teachers and club members and Jake's excitement shines through in his smile.

The Kadina Croquet Club continues to support and nurture inclusion in sport and the students still come out to play as part of the school PE curriculum.

### West Lakes Croquet Club

The Club was established after a founding member, John Hazeal, was driving past Hawkesbury Reserve one day and noticed a billboard showing the site of a community club, including a diagram with a rectangular piece marked croquet. He and a few other interested people had voiced concern over the lack of croquet facilities in the local area and consequently, after seeing the proposed Community Club, he called a meeting at his home on 24 July 1984 to a propose the formation of West Lakes Croquet Club (WLCC). WLCC became affiliated with the West Lakes Community and Sporting Club, today known as Club West Lakes. For the first two years games were played on the Alberton Croquet Club lawns. There was a 12 month delay in planting the West Lakes lawns, but after a lot of hard work, including interminable weeding, the greens were opened by Kevin Hamilton MP on the 30th November 1986.

In the early years there were some hiccoughs, such as one of the lights going out during night play and the outside council watering system going off in the middle of games and spraying players. Over the years a first for a metropolitan area was established in that WLCC was permitted to use one of the bowling greens for annual city versus country competitions. Although this arrangement has lapsed it played an important part in the development of the croquet club.

The club has never been huge but had some very talented players, including Nancy Wittingham, who was President of SACA in the mid 1990s. In 1997 she again managed the State team, which won the Eire Cup (Australian Championships) for the third successive year. (At that time SA had won this event on 27 occasions since its inception in 1937).

In the early years much effort was given to fundraising, holding gala days and participating in competition. Over the years WLCC has won several pennants in SACA competitions. These days, however, our members are ageing and less are able to play in SACA competitions; some only come out occasionally for social games. Members enjoy the social connection that the club provides and the WLCC committee see the promotion of croquet as important to healthy ageing, as it provides both physical and mental stimulation.

The Club would love to be able to attract younger players (in fact players of any age), but as with many clubs this is difficult, with so many competing sports and leisure activities to attract young people. We hold social days for other community clubs in the area and have also had interest from a school that holds an annual sports' camp at West Beach. For two years boys of about 10 and 11 years of age have attended WLCC and enjoyed learning the game and showing off their quickly acquired skills. A photo below illustrates such a day.
