## AC Directors Report, 08/04/2024

The AC team performed very well this year. Below are some statistics on each player and the doubles pairings; also the summary of the Eire Cup results. As can be observed, the team's win ratio was 61%. Looking at previous Eire Cups, winning percentages in the 60% range of 2 or more teams seems to suggest a close competition. A winning percentage of 70% or more seems to suggest a team's certainty of an Eire Cup victory. Moving forward, our goal for next year should be to improve individual win/loss ratio's.

The team played very well together and there were no issues in regards to player behaviour. Everyone supported each other and the team seemed very cohesive. This no doubt reflected in a very good performance from the team.

## 2024 Eire Cup

This year's Eire cup was contested in Tasmania. The croquet lawns were presented beautifully and I estimate an average speed of 10.5 to 11 seconds. Croquet Tasmania did an excellent job in organising the whole event. They certainly made it easy to organise our team, even though we were at split venues. The format for the Eire Cup is 4 mixed double games followed by 4 ranked singles then reversed singles for both the men and women. A total of 20 games per test.

Well, what a year for SA. After a fantastic effort from the team, we came 2nd.

On day 1, we played Queensland. Starting with doubles, we won all four games. It goes to show how important a good start is as the Queensland women came back strong winning 3 from 4 games. The SA men played well winning all 4 singles. Again the Queensland women played well winning 3 from 4 singles. The second round of men's singles was much more even with the score at 2 all. At the end of the day, we won the test 12 games to 8.

Day 2 against WA, saw another great start from the team. We won all our doubles. The team was a bit more settled and it showed in our final scores. We had a convincing victory of 16 games to 4.

Day 3. We were up against Victoria. The strongest team on paper. After the doubles, we were 3-1 down. The first round of singles was a tough battle. Our women only won 1 from 4 but the men rallied and won 3 from 4. Going into the last round of singles the score was 7-5 to the Vics. With 8 singles to go, we certainly gave ourselves a chance. At the end of the day, the Vics kept their 2 game lead to defeat SA 11-9. Again the result showed how important the doubles are.

Day 4. Another tough day, this time against NSW. After the doubles the score was 2 games each. The NSW women played very strong winning 3 from 4 singles and our men evened the ledger by winning 3 from 4. So after the doubles and first round of singles the score was tied at 6 games apiece. The SA women fought well and won 2 from 4 singles. It was really tight. The men's games were tough. Playing on bowls courts that were 80% dirt. It could have gone either way but we managed to get 3 from 4 games to win the day 11 games to 9.

Day 5. Mathematically, we still had a chance to win the Eire Cup. We needed NSW to thrash the Vics, and for us to thrash Tasmania. The Tassies came out strong and won 3 from 4 doubles. Our backs were against the wall. The Vics had a good lead on NSW so we were fighting for the silver medal. Our women fought hard and won 3 from 4 and our men followed also winning 3 from 4. In the last round of singles we could not relax. We needed to win the day to secure second place. The men played well and won 3 from 4 followed by a strong performance from the women to also win 3 from 4. Second Place and silver was ours.

I am very proud of our team, especially the way everyone supported each other. As the Captain, I could not have asked more from a great bunch of people, who stayed positive and fought every battle with gusto and respect.

Maybe next year SA, maybe next year.
