

SACA Board Minutes from Meeting Held at Hutt Rd 14th of April 4:30pm

Present

Moved by Paul that Minutes from last meeting be accepted. Seconded Sally. Passed

Kevin welcomed Karen Tierney(North Adelaide.) Moved by Kim, seconded by Sally that the Board accepts Anne Woodhouse's resignation. Paul moved that Karen be added to the Board. Seconded by Sally. Both motions passed.

Business arising from last meeting

Ansi's report as GC Coordinator

Ansi's report as Facilites Manager

Work could start In May. Some of the Grant money was used on improving lawn surrounds for Eire Cup, but remainder to be used for work by Council.

Croquet SA Board Golf Croquet Coordinators Report 9 April 2025

The Board requested that a sub-committee consisting of the Facilities Manager, Kim Millhouse and Jim Carter to review SACA's current Weather Policy. In response to the extreme heat during the Eyre Cup in Marcg 2025. The sub-committee will review the policy in the coming months, during the cooler weather to be finalised before next summer.

Croquet Australia is to introduce an umpire level of officiating in GC to overcome the lack of referees at club and region level.

The Referee sub-committee is finalising the training requirements for new GC Umpires. Croquet Australia is advocating for umpires who do not need to know all the rules of GC. Umpires will only need to know Rules No. 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12. Umpires will not interpret these rules but decide on matters of fact. They will also need to complete and open book and an oral exam, complete the Australian Sports Commission online Community Officiating Essential Skills Course. and demonstrate their on-court ability for their knowledge, judgement, and application of the rules.

To assist in identifying these umpires we request that the Board approve the expenditure to purchase a green coloured cap and bib and the cost of office materials. Cost approximately \$20.00 per person. A badge may or may not be provided by CA.

Facilities Managers Report To the SACA Board of Directors 9 April 2025

ON Monday 7 April 2025 met with Kevin LePoidevin, Adelaide Council Project Manager and a plumbing contractor to discuss the rainwater flooding our lawns. Several options were discussed with the most consistent idea is that 90mm plastic downpipes will be installed, a trench to be dug next to the concrete footpath and routed around to the back of the building and exit into the parklands. From there are several options; the stormwater will enter into a soakage pit, enter a holding tank and soak into the ground, enter into a holding tank and then pumped out to the street stormwater drainage system.

Our flooding issues are going to be addressed, and work is expected to begin in May 2025. There is no information if there is any costing at this stage.

I am requesting that the state flags flown during the Eyre Cup and the Interstate Shield need to be replaced as some of the eyelets have ripped from the flag material, and the flags have pulled threads from being caught on the hedge. The hedge has been growing in recent years and the flags keep snagging on the thorns. To address this problem, I would like to be able to purchase extra extension pieces to heighten the flag posts. The flag replacement and the extension pieces would need to be budgeted for.

 Australian Flag @ \$30.00 = \$30.00
 Extension flag post @ \$30.00 = \$300.00

Eire Cup

 Press releases were sent out on 28th February and 7th March to 18 various media platforms radio, TV, newspapers, and online platforms, both city and regional. Country platforms were informed of specific country



- players in their region, with permission of the country players.
- Response: The Pirie Recorder interviewed Simon Hockey, who was featured in that paper and a Farmer's publication. A photo of him receiving his gold medal was forwarded. Channel 7 weather person made contact but did not follow up despite another reminder. CA was also involved with FB posts.
- A subsequent press release was issued following the gold medal event, again mentioning the country players with photos, permission granted by players, also contacted the Victor Times regarding Kate Logan and Shirley Howlett participation.
- I also assembled 80 welcome bags for the players. It was impossible to get free samples, I included flyers for the Fringe, Adelaide experience and local companies e g Berenberg, Haigh's.
- I was disappointed with the response, but we were competing with the Fringe, Womad, the Adelaide festival and a car race.

Sponsorship

I've had contact with C of A regarding the use of the 'hort' wall for signage. This was declined; signage can be placed on the west cyclone fence facing inward. I've had the sponsorship document, and the website updated. I will now proceed to contact the equipment makers and access large statewide organisations for sponsorship.
